
## Overview / Potential Impacts



- Cold temperatures beginning Thursday and lasting through the weekend. Warming up on Monday.
- 2 Potential Lowland Snow / Freezing Rain Events
  - Round 1 Late Thursday through Friday afternoon
  - Round 2 Friday night through Saturday morning
- Focus will be on the 1<sup>st</sup> system
  - Potential Impacts
    - Primary Travel
    - Secondary Power Interruptions

## Thursday (2/11) Step #1: Cold Air Moves In






#### Forecast Low Temperatures Thursday Night

### Forecast High Temperatures on Friday




This appears to be the coldest night



#### Snow Forecast Thursday Morning through Friday afternoon







The snow forecast is most uncertain in the central valley, as temperatures will be marginal. If the coldest model guidance verifies, these spots will likely wind up with more snow than depicted here.




Gusts 50-60 mph over the western Columbia Gorge

Gusty winds should result in blowing snow in the west Columbia Gorge and eastern portions of the Portland/Vancouver metro. Significantly reduced visibilities

Location	Approximate Start Time	Most Likely Precipitation Type
Hood River and the Columbia Gorge	2am to 6am Thursday	Snow
Portland/Vancouver metro area	10am to 2pm Thursday (brief period of freezing rain possible before 10 am)	Mainly snow, however some freezing rain is possible between 7-10 am Thursday.
Central Willamette Valley	6pm to 11pm Thursday	Mainly freezing rain, but some snow too.
South WA/North OR Coast	7pm to 11pm Thursday	Mainly freezing rain, but some snow possible south WA coast
Cascades/Foothills	2am-6am Thursday	Both snow and freezing rain (except Lane County Cascade Foothills where mainly rain is expected)
Willapa Hills	10am-2pm Thursday	Snow

# More snow and ice with even greater impacts?

- Similar Locations At Most Risk, but...
  - Snow/Ice Threat May Extend Further to the South and West
- Snow Amounts Potentially a Little Heavier
- Some Risk of Freezing Rain / Sleet southern periphery
- A second webinar is planned on *Friday* to discuss the potential second round of precip Friday night into Saturday

### Summary / Impacts



- Becoming colder on Thursday and especially Thursday night.
- Cold temperatures will be prolonged, and some spots may not warm up to above freezing until Sunday or Monday.
- Round 1 brings accumulating snow and freezing rain to most of the area Thursday through Friday afternoon. South Willamette Valley, Lane County Cascade Foothills, and central OR coast may be spared from round 1 with just rain.
- •Round 2 brings more accumulating snow and freezing rain Friday night into Saturday, which may be more impactful. The south valley has a better chance for snow and ice from round 2.
